



Today we are going to talk about wildfires, and how you can be prepared and stay safe.


A Wildfire is an uncontrolled fire that can destroy large areas of land.

WHAT CAUSES WILDFIRES?

Sparks from equipment, power lines, lightning, campfires or vehicles can cause wildfires; especially with high winds, dry grass and trees.



Color the spark from the lawnmower yellow.

Color the campfire orange.

Color the power lines brown.

Color the matches red.

Color the lightning yellow.

Wildfires spread in places with grass, dry brush and forests.






© Color the pictures that show where wildfires are likely to happen.

Keep the area around your house safe from things that can catch fire: trim trees, cut grass, move wood and remove leaf piles.






Wood

EXIT 1




Help Rocket practice his home escape plan. Use a blue crayon to draw the path to exit 1. Use a green crayon to draw the path to exit 2.

Have an emergency supply kit ready. Remember to take it with you


if you need to leave in a hurry!

Have an emergency kit ready and an evacuation plan for your pets. If asked to leave, take your pets and leave immediately.




Circle the items that belong in your animal emergency kit. Then, color this page.

If your clothes catch on fire, do not run! STOP where you are, DROP to the ground, COVER your face and ROLL to put out the fire. Don't forget to close your eyes!








AT THE SHELTER
